### **Headteacher Update**

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope you have all enjoyed our Bank Holiday weekends and the small glimpses of summer we've had! Despite the lack of sunshine this week the children have cheered things up in their lovely summer uniform. As things warm up, just a reminder that summer dresses should be blue (and white) and shorts should be black or grey. Black legging shorts are for P.E. lessons only.
