Dear Parents and Carers,

As you know as a school we have signed up for the NSPCC "Kindness Challenge" project whereby children are encouraged to carry out acts of kindness in school, at home and in the community. 

Happy weekend everyone!



This half term the children in Years 1 and 2 have been learning all about York. Our theme, 'Out of My Window', has involved the children learning about their local area of Acomb, as well as key landmarks in York city centre.

We began by looking at aerial pictures of landmarks in Acomb and discussing how we could identify and name them by using clues in the pictures. We went for a walk around Acomb, stopping at each landmark and working out where we were on our maps. Once we were back, we drew our route onto a map and worked out which direction (North, South, East or West) we walked when travelling between each landmark.

We then looked at aerial photographs of landmarks in York city centre, and in particular Clifford's Tower. In our history lessons, we looked at how the appearance of York Castle had changed over the past 950 years, until there was just Clifford's Tower left! We also learnt about key events that had happened at the castle since it was built in 1068.

The following week we went on a trip to see Clifford's Tower as it looks today. We climbed the steep spiral staircases to get right to the top of the castle where we could see all those landmarks that we had been learning about from the top! We also explored the Castle Museum where we were very excited to see the Victorian Street and the 'Toys Through Time' exhibit. We were even brave enough to walk through the old Victorian prison and learn about some of the prisoners who were locked up there hundreds of years ago!

This week we have been learning about the artwork of LS Lowry as we prepare to draw and paint our own version of his famous Clifford's Tower painting. In English we have been reading stories all about Knights, Castles and Dragons ready to write our instructions for 'How to Train a Dragon' next week! Team Seahorse are looking forward to telling you more about their instruction writing in their class assembly next week.
