Learning Challenges

In our first half term, we will be exploring our theme of 'Protecting What is Precious.'

Within this theme, we will be exploring how the different seasons affect where we and nature live. We will also be looking at what we can do to protect our planet.

In the second half term, our theme will be 'Fairy tales.' We will share lots of traditional tales, as well as some mixed up alternative versions. We may also be visited by some of our favourite characters form our stories.

In planning time, we will be encouraging the children to share their own ideas, and to listen to their friend's.

Physical Development

For the Orca, outdoors is simply an extension of our curriculum so we would ask you to bring extra clothing each day to allow your child to benefit from all-weather experiences.

Outdoors is full of fascinating and interesting experiences, large building bricks, seesaws, scooters and imaginative play.

Please remember to bring a change of clothes

Mathematics
In mathematics, we will have lots of fun saying number rhymes and exploring numbers within our play. Children will explore shapes, naming and describing 2D shapes and using 2D and 3D shapes to make pictures and build models. This can be supported by pointing out numbers and shapes as you walk about. Please use the vocabulary of big, small, round, flat, long, short and tall.
