This half term in Key Stage One, our exciting topic has been "From Farm to Fork," where we have been exploring the fascinating journeys that our food takes before it reaches our plates. The children have engaged in various activities and lessons, discovering how different foods are grown, harvested, processed, and transported. The highlight of our term was undoubtedly this week's visit to Farmer Dave's farm. The Key Stage 1 children were thrilled to have this hands-on learning experience, which brought our classroom lessons to life in a vibrant and memorable way.

Upon arriving at the farm, the children got to feel and see a variety of seeds which grow into different crops such as wheat and barley. They were then super eager to see the vast array of machinery that farmers use in their daily tasks. From tractors to ploughs, each piece of equipment was explained and demonstrated, showing the children how technology aids in farming. We even got to test our strength of horsepower to see if we could make the trailers and tractors move!

The visit continued with a tour of the barn, where the children saw cows up close. They learned about the different breeds of cows and their role on the farm, from milk production to contributing to the meat supply. Did you know that a cow has 4 stomachs? The children were amazed to see the cows and enjoyed learning about their diet and habits. We then got to try out the exciting cattle handler machine. The children got to experience first hand how the farmers check to see if the cows are healthy and how they get their injections.

This visit to Farmer Dave's farm has been an invaluable part of our "From Farm to Fork" topic, providing a tangible and interactive experience that the children will remember for years to come. The children returned to school with a deeper appreciation of where their food comes from and the hard work that goes into farming.
